Developmental Screening

What is "Developmental Screening Day?"

Skills such as taking first steps, saying those first words and learning early concepts are referred to as "milestones of development". The range of "average" developmental attainment of these milestones for young children can be broad.

Developmental screenings are used by doctors, nurses, early interventionists and educators to determine whether a child is reaching developmental markers. Every fall your school district offers an opportunity to participate in a free screening of developmental milestones for children ages birth to five years. This screening is brought to you because of a collaborative effort between your school district, the Gallatin-Madison Special Education Cooperative, Family Outreach Services and the Region IV Hearing Conservation Program. On your school district's "Developmental Day" the following areas will be screened:

Gross Motor: using large groups of muscles to perform physical activities, such as skipping, jumping and throwing.

Fine Motor: motor: using hands and fingers to be perform activities such as drawing and writing.

Language: speech sound development or articulation, vocabulary understanding and use, language reasoning and early phonic skills.

Developmental Concepts: Understanding terms such as more/less; sorting and categorizing, colors and other pre-academic knowledge.

Social: Following directions and engaging with others
